



Membership in NEACAC is based on the academic year from September through August.

Membership categories and costs are:

- Collegiate institutions within New England: \$50 including primary member, \$5 per additional member
- Collegiate institutions outside New England: \$60 including primary member, \$5 per additional member
- Secondary schools and school districts within New England: \$25 for unlimited staff members
- Secondary schools outside New England, but within the US: \$30 for unlimited staff members
- International secondary schools: \$55 for a three year membership
- Graduate students: \$10
- Retired individuals: \$15
- Affiliate institutions, mail recipients, independent counselors within New England and other organizations: \$60 including primary member, \$5 per additional member
- Associate independent counselors: \$70
